Resolution No. 2026-03
AUTHORIZATION OF MILLAGE RENEWAL
FOR ROAD REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the residents and taxpayers of Middlebury Township to continue to provide funding for construction, maintenance, repair, and improvement of roads within Middlebury Township;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Middlebury Township shall place a Road Millage renewal request on the August 2026 election ballot. The ballot request shall be for 2 mills per year for five years for the sole purpose of construction, maintenance repair, and improvement of roads within Middlebury Township, as follows:

MILLAGE RENEWAL FOR ROAD MAINTENANCE

Shall Middlebury Township continue to levy two mills (\$2.00 per \$1,000,000) on taxable value of property located in the Township of Middlebury, Shiawassee County, Michigan, for five years beginning with the 2026 tax levy year and running through the 2030 tax levy year (inclusive), which will raise in the first year of such levy and estimated revenue of \$119,798 to be used exclusively for the specific purpose of construction, maintenance, repair, and improvement of roads within the Township? If approved, this millage will be a renewal of previously authorized millage.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution rescinds Resolution 2020-06, adopted May 12, 2026, which provided this renewal request be placed on the August 2026 election ballot.

Motion was made by Treasurer Jill Ruess and supported by Trustee Gene Ruess to adopt the foregoing resolution.
